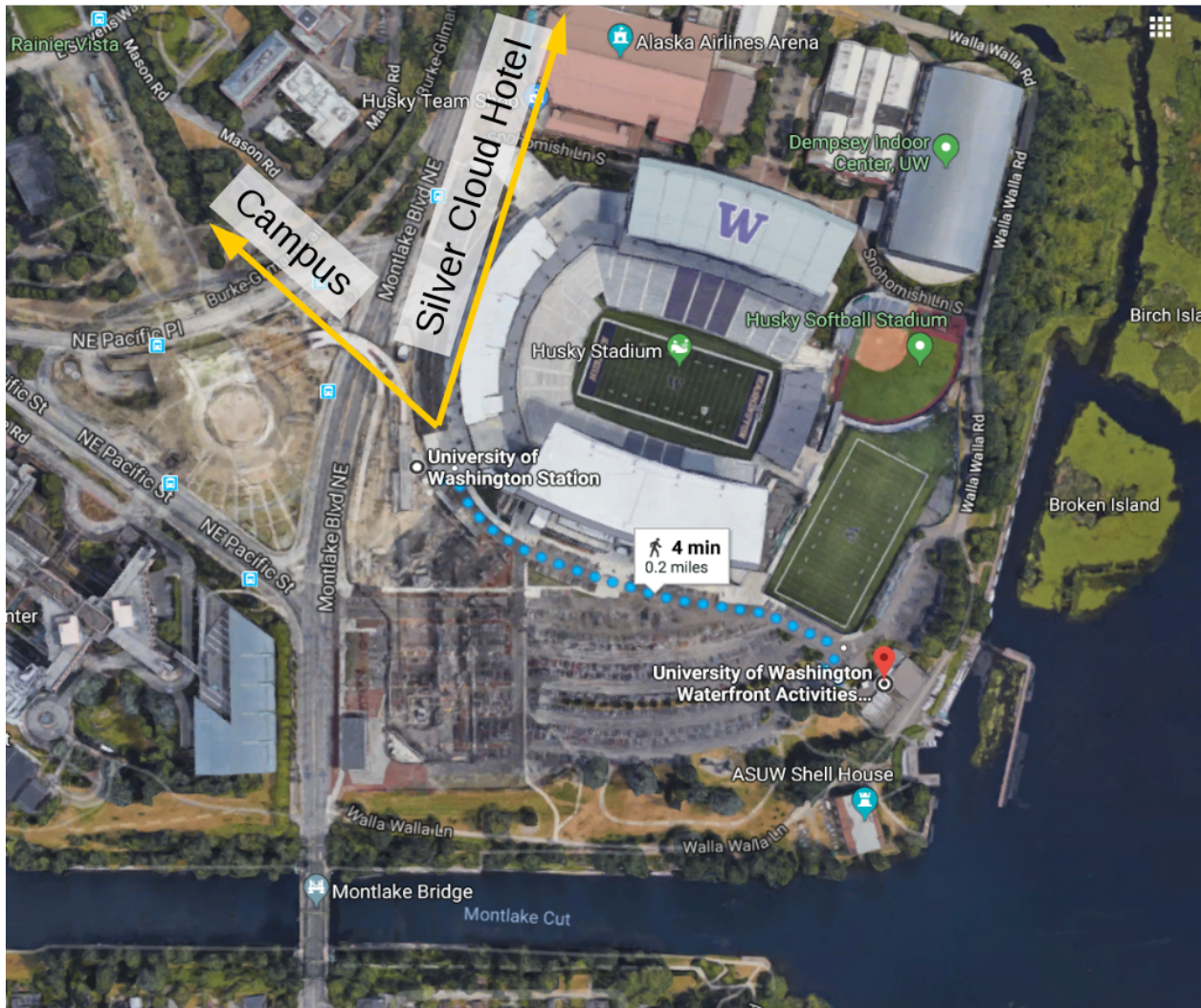


NetOps IX at the UW Waterfront Activities Center (WAC) - Seattle

March 20-21, 2018

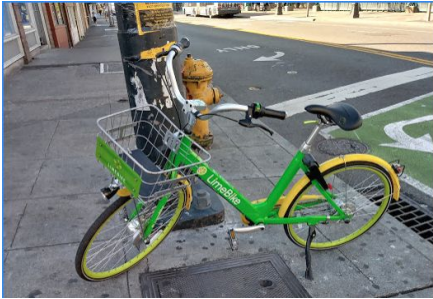
Local Weather, looking good: <http://www.king5.com/weather>



Transport options from Silver Cloud Hotel on 25th Ave NE to WAC:

- Limited seating (14) Hotel Shuttle Bus to University of Washington Station, leaves at 7:00 am (doors of the facility will still be closed) and at 7:30am, you will be well on time).

- Take the 372 bus to the University (bus stop across the street from Silver Cloud) exact change needed, get out at the Rainier Vista/UW Light Rail Station stop, walk the rest (see maps).
- Walk, either via 25th and sport facilities (google's direction, or via the Burke-Gilman trail) ~30 minutes.
- Grab a LimeBike and cycle to the WAC: <http://www.limebike.com/>

- Call a regular taxi

Getting back to SeaTac international airport

- Plan to be at the UW station ~1 hour before you want to be at the Airport:
 - Light Rail train leaves UW every 6 min (in the afternoons)
 - UW-SeaTac takes 45 minutes
 - Walk from train to Departures takes ~4 min.
